Get a tax break!

One thing teachers often don't take advantage of? "Tax write-offs," says expert Alexandra Freeze. "Most don't realize they can deduct up to \$250-or \$500 if married, filing jointly and both spouses are educators—for unreimbursed school supplies." Who's eligible? K-12 teachers, instructors, counselors, principals or aides who work at least 900 hours per school year.

Arby's: 10% off; Chick-Fil-A: 10% off or free small drink; Denny's: 10% off, 20% off for AARP members; IHOP: 10% off; McDonald's: discounts on coffee; Wendy's: 10% off.

STARTING AT AGE 60.

Mary Kay Cosmetics: Military personnel and dependents receive 10% off on online orders. Reference your service affiliation, and get more discounts by contacting the website. Sally Beauty Supply: Discount varies; simply ask and have a valid military ID with you.

Regal Movie Theaters: Matinee prices for all show times; United Artist Movie Theaters: Matinee prices for all show times;

IMAX: \$1 off tickets. **HOME AND GARDEN**

Lowe's: Michael's: 10% off Wednesdays at select stores; Home Depot: 10% off for active duty, active reserve, retired military and immediate family.
